

## Recommended EKU Graduate-level History courses for

### Master of Arts in Education: Secondary – History concentration

Each of the courses listed below is a special topics class. This means that the specific subject matter of the course will be different from semester to semester. Our program offers an online seminar every summer and one online seminar every fall and spring semester. **HIS 860 Readings in American History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours)** Seminar on selected developments in American history. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided the subject matter differs each time.

**HIS 861 Readings in European History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours)** Seminar on selected developments in European history. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided the subject matter differs each time.

**HIS 862 Readings in Asian/African History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours).** Seminar on selected developments in Asian or African history. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided subject matter differs each time.

**HIS 863 Readings in Latin America History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours)** Seminar on selected developments in Latin American history. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided subject matter differs each time.

**HIS 864 Comparative History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours)** Seminar on issues in comparative history. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided the subject matter differs each time.

**HIS 865 Conceptualizing History:\_\_\_\_. (3 hours).** Analysis of recent trends in the teaching and conceptualizing of world history, western civilization, and/or U.S. History. May be retaken to a maximum of nine hours, provided the subject matter differs each time.

Students in this program also have the option of taking graduate-level education or social studies education courses offered in the College of Education.
